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popular culture an introductory text provides the means for a new examination of the different faces of the american character in both its historical and contemporary identities the text is highlighted by a series of extensive introductions to various categories of popular culture and by essays that demonstrate how the methods discussed in the introductions can be applied this volume is an exciting beginning for the study of the materials of everyday life that define our culture and confirm our individual senses of identity

informative and entertaining introduction to the study of popular culture as the culture of the people popular culture provides a sense of identity that binds individuals to the greater society and unites the masses on ideals of acceptable forms of behavior lessons learned from popular culture offers an informative and entertaining look at the social relevance of popular culture focusing on a wide range of topics including film television social media music radio cartoons and comics books fashion celebrities sports and virtual reality tim delaney and tim madigan demonstrate how popular culture in contrast to folk or high culture gives individuals an opportunity to impact modify or even change prevailing sentiments and norms of behavior for each topic they include six engaging and accessible stories that conclude with short life lessons whether you re a fan of the big bang theory or seinfeld the beatles or beyoncé charlie brown or superman there s something for everyone

popular culture in american history collects the most widely cited and important writings on three hundred years of american popular culture each of the ten essays serves as a case study of a particular moment issue or form of popular culture from seventeenth century chapbooks to hip hop pedagogical features include further reading lists contextualizing editorial introductions discussion questions and chronologies of key events

in the soul of popular culture leading writers and critics many of them influenced by the thought of c g jung draw upon the insights of depth psychology to delve into the meanings of tv programs like star trek and fawly towers movies such as the piano and the silence of the lambs and other contemporary media as well as the public preoccupation with such issues as abortion aids the o j simpson trial and our enduring fascination with elvis

popular culture is a central part of everyday life to many americans personalities such as elvis presley oprah winfrey and michael jordan are more recognizable to many people than are most elected officials with amusement for all is the first comprehensive history of two centuries of mass entertainment in the united states covering everything from the penny press to playboy the nba to nascar big band to hip hop and other topics including film comics television sports dance and music paying careful attention to matters of race gender class technology economics and politics leroy ashby emphasizes the complex ways in which popular culture simultaneously reflects and transforms american culture revealing that the world of entertainment constantly evolves as it tries to meet the demands of a diverse audience trends in popular entertainment often reveal the tensions between competing ideologies appetites and values in american society for example in the late nineteenth century americans embraced self made men such as john d rockefeller and andrew carnegie the celebrities of the day were circus tycoons p t barnum and james a bailey wild west star buffalo bill cody professional baseball organizer albert spalding and prizefighter john l sullivan at the same time however several female performers challenged traditional notions of weak frail victorian women adah isaacs menken astonished crowds by wearing tights that made her

appear nude while performing dangerous stunts on horseback and the shows of the voluptuous burlesque group british blondes often centered on provocative images of female sexual power and dominance ashby describes how history and politics frequently influence mainstream entertainment when native americans blacks and other non whites appeared in the nineteenth century circuses and wild west shows it was often to perpetuate demeaning racial stereotypes crowds jeered sitting bull at cody s shows by the early twentieth century however black minstrel acts reveled in racial tensions reinforcing stereotypes while at the same time satirizing them and mocking racist attitudes before a predominantly white audience decades later red foxx and richard pryor s profane comedy routines changed american entertainment the raw ethnic material of pryor s short lived television show led to a series of african american sitcoms in the 1980s that presented common american experiences from family life to college life with black casts mainstream entertainment has often co opted and sanitized fringe amusements in an ongoing process of redefining the cultural center and its boundaries social control and respectability vied with the bold erotic sensational and surprising as entrepreneurs sought to manipulate the vagaries of the market control shifting public appetites and capitalize on campaigns to protect public morals rock n roll was one such fringe culture in the 1950s elvis blurred gender norms with his androgynous style and challenged conventions of public decency with his sexually charged performances by the end of the 1960s bob dylan introduced the social consciousness of folk music into the rock scene and the beatles embraced hippie counter culture don mclean s 1971 anthem american pie served as an epitaph for rock s political core which had been replaced by the spectacle of hard rock acts such as kiss and alice cooper while rock n roll did not lose its ability to shock in less than three decades it became part of the established order that it had originally sought to challenge with amusement for all provides the context to what americans have done for fun since 1830 showing the reciprocal nature of the relationships between social political economic and cultural forces and the way in which the entertainment world has reflected refracted or reinforced the values those forces represent in america

the myth of popular culture from dante to dylan is a fascinating examination of the cultural traditions of the american novel hollywood and british and american rock music which leads us to redefine our concept of the division between high and low culture a stimulating history of high and low culture from dante alighieri to bob dylan providing a controversial defence of popular culture seeks to rebut the durable belief that only high culture is dialectical and popular culture is not by turning theodor adorno s theories on pop against themselves presents a critical analysis of three popular traditions the american novel hollywood and british and american rock music offers an original account of bob dylan as an example of how the distinction between high and low culture is highly problematic a provocative book for any student scholar or general reader who is interested in popular culture
